

Foss Park: A Century of Serenity, History, and Legacy

Step back in time to 1918, when Mr. and Mrs. Foss first walked these gentle hills, envisioning a peaceful retreat among wildlife and whispering pines. Picture the quiet joy of simple days - rolling hills, starlit nights, and the calming rhythm of nature. Fast forward to 1941, when laughter echoed across the meadows as campers explored trails, shared stories over hearty meals in the cookhouse, gathered in the chapel for reflection, and napped under the shade of towering trees. Foss Park evolved into a sanctuary for rest, community, and connection. Today, that legacy lives on. Foss Park remains a serene paradise - now with the comforts of modern living thoughtfully integrated into every detail. Spanning 159 acres, this one-of-a-kind property offers a rare blend of rich history and timeless tranquility, just minutes from Highway 285 and 74, and adjacent to protected Denver Mountain Parks and large privately held tracts of land.

Foss Park History

Any history of Foss Park would be incomplete without understanding the personal history of the property, Foss Park and it's benefactors, particularly Mrs. Foss. Mrs. Foss moved to Denver from Chicago around 1899 for health reasons, specifically asthma. She and her husband, Martin L. Foss established a wholesale bicycle business which later became a metal, industrial and tool supply business. They joined the First Baptist Church of Denver in 1900 and traveled extensively. They eventually bought a 159 acre ranch in Indian Hills in 1918, where they built a cottage and barn. They preserved the natural state of the ranch, planted trees and flowers, and enjoyed the beauty of the location until 1938. (Excerpt from handwritten letter, dated 1941)

History of Construction

Between 1918 and 1938, Mr. and Mrs. Foss built a 820 square foot cabin, a 288 square foot barn and planted over 1,800 trees on the property. Upon Mrs. Foss' death in 1938, the 158 acre parcel was deeded to the First Baptist Church of Denver. Beginning in 1938 and continuing over the course of more than a decade, the Church built multiple structures on the southeasterly 40 acres of the site for use as a summer camp and church retreat and used the property continuously until 2012. These improvements included: an assembly hall with lodging space, a dormitory building, a picnic shelter, a caretakers cottage, a garage and a dining hall. Of special significance to the site is the 853 square foot chapel that was built by Mr. Foss in 1940 in memory of his wife of 38 years. This structure sits on a prominent location amongst 100 year old Ponderosa pine trees and offers spectacular views of the property. (Excerpt from handwritten letter, dated 1941)







Foss Chapel 853 square feet

The chapel was built in 1940 and has electricity, church pews, the original fired clay Heinz tiles, stained glass windows, stone floors and a decorative wood ceiling.

Architectural plans are available for a full renovation. Construction drawings are available for complete Kolbe Elevation window replacement. Plans included adding new windows, a sound system and updating the electrical system to add historical and legacy value.








Agriculture Building
